- Parades and fire service functions that whole families can enjoy.

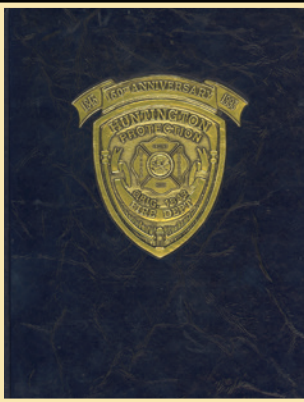
And in addition to the sense of community service, new recruits develop close bonds amongst the membership that is found virtually nowhere else.

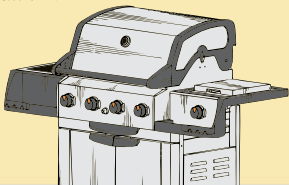

SAFETY TIPS PROPANE GRILL SAFETY

Never take propane grill usage, storage and transportation lightly. Hundreds of fires and injuries occur annually from gas grill fires and explosions*.

- 1 Start right. Obtain propane only from reputable compressed gas suppliers.
- 2 Before filling, check propane cylinder for damage.
- 3 Always check for leaks when replacing cylinders. Never use a grill until all leaks are repaired.
- 4 Check burner tubes regularly for blockages.
- 5 Make sure all connections are secure BEFORE turning on the gas.
- 6 Keep the lid open when starting. Gas can accumulate and may cause an explosion when ignited.
- 7 Never store propane cylinders indoors or near any heat source.
- 8 Never transport or store propane cylinders in the trunk of your automobile.
- 9 Always shut off the propane fuel at the grill AND the bottle.
- 10 If there is a fire involving the tank, evacuate immediately and call 911.

We were extremely busy with our annual recertification requirements, including our personal escape systems and SCBA (Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus).

Exciting things are happening at Leverich Place! We have finalized specifications on a new squad/engine (ETA early fall). We also acquired a used 75-foot tower ladder, which along with our 100-foot quint (pumper/ladder truck), will help us protect our ever growing commercial district. Firefighters will be busy training on the apparatus and learning new techniques. We also will start our annual chauffeur recertification on all the various apparatus.

175 Years in 2018!

When we're not busy training or responding to emergency calls, we have concentrated on our

milestone 175th anniversary. The committees have spent countless hours planning a public celebration to be held July 28, 2018. Mark your calendars! Our Museum Committee has been working vigorously to complete the HFD Museum along with the return of our completely refurbished original 1921 American LaFrance pumper. It was the first motorized pumper in the township of Huntington and also one of the first on Long Island. It was in service here until 1947. A private owner kindly donated this truck a few years back.
